12 00 00 FURNISHINGS

12 20 00 - WINDOW TREATMENT

A. General

1. Blinds, shades and draperies shall be furnished and installed by the Constructor.

12 30 00 - LABORATORY CASEWORK

A. General

- Wood is preferred over metal for general use, although in some projects metal may be appropriate. The University maintains negotiated contracts with specific vendors; coordinate with Owner's Representative.
- 2. Check with the Owner's Representative for detailed requirements for working surface top material and for specific types of equipment.

12 31 00 - SITE FURNISHINGS

A. General

1. Intent of selections is to create a uniform appearance within campus open spaces. Designer may request a variation from Owner's Representative.

B. Materials

- 1. Bike Rack:
 - a) 'Triangle Rack' by Kay Park Recreation, color: powdercoat black.
 - b) 'EXPO 7510 by Cora, color: plastic coated black.

2. Benches:

- a) Backed Bench: PRS-127, 8' length, by Victor Stanley, no center arm, surface mount, color: black.
- b) Backless Bench: PRS-112, 8' length, by Victor Stanley, no center arm, surface mount, color: black.

3. Tables:

a) Carousel Table, by Landscape Forms, 3-4 seat or 5-6 seat, backed seats, round
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table, steelhead perforated table and seats, umbrella hole, color: black.

4. Waste Receptacles:

a) Waste and recycling program currently being updated. Seek guidance from Owner's Representative.

5. Bollard:

a) Cast-in-Place concrete per custom detail. Refer to Appendix Drawings.

12 48 00 - RUGS AND MATS

A. General

12 50 00 - FURNITURE

A. General

12 60 00 - MULTIPLE SEATING

A. General

- 1. Discuss with the Owner's' Representative the type of seating to be used in various rooms to ensure proper mounting facilities when required.
- 2. The Design Professional is responsible for making determinations on room capacity and for recommending seating and layouts for all class and lecture rooms.

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
