Windee Weiss presented HPELS Future Vision and Needs for the Task Force meeting and gave the committee a handout, "Future Vision and Needs". The committee went over several points listed on the handout.

Tennis

- Tennis classes fill fast, and last eight weeks.
- Classes can't play outside for four weeks due to weather each semester.
 - Good consideration for indoor tennis courts.

Obstacle course

- Jed is talking to people about funding an obstacle course.
 - o Finding funding for equipment before space is probably a bad idea.
 - Windee and Doris will take care of the issue
- Previous talks with ROTC, but never moved forward with the plan.

Frisbee golf/Driving range

- Space could be used for other things
- Driving range may not be a good idea due to excess golf balls always around.
- UNI used to have a driving range, but 90% of one person's job was upkeep of that space.
- City of Cedar Falls built an indoor simulator for golf

Outdoor classroom by Dry Run Creek

- CEEE Earth class with bleachers
 - This space could be used more effectively
- Find how many classes could use it
- Data from Rebecca C. about human usage of area by Dry Run Creek
- Park-like settings are popular with outdoor classes and regular classes that just want to be outside for a day

Nielsen Fieldhouse

- HPELS will eventually grow to 30 lectures and 60 labs.
 - Questions arose to where the school would put all of the classes and labs.
 - HPELS wants to put the classes in open fields and the Nielsen Fieldhouse.
- Childhood development has the gym rented five days a week
 - They are good about the space being used by others at the same time.
- Athletics wants entire building.
- West-Gym: Wrestling would stay in that space it is too good of a space to move them.

- Track and softball have no roots there, and no offices as well.
- o Suggested that Childhood Center should leave
- Long-term use of the field house has not been determined.

Track

• \$600,000 to redo indoor track surfaces.

Trails

- Each 25 sports groups have to put in a certain amount of volunteer hours to maintain status in their tier.
 - o Possibly use them to take care of trails and outdoor spaces
 - Suggested to use faculty/staff volunteer time as well

All in all, HPELS has its hands in everything regarding sports and outdoor spaces.
